Drew G.I. Hart was writing about the Dred Scott decision in which the U.S. Supreme Court voted 7-2 that "black people were not citizens and would never be." He wrote, "Of course these men were all products of their time and social location.... Being a product of one's time doesn't absolve anyone. We are *all* people of our time. We either renew our minds and become transformed or we conform to the dominant ideologies that convince us that we are moral despite what is going on around us."

Within the Christian tradition, we can say some of our Biblical texts reflect the social understandings of their time, just as Martin Luther's writings about Jews and women were influenced by his society. As citizens of the world we can point to Jim Crow laws and worldwide atrocities and say they were all products of their time. However, God continues to call us to be transformed, to let our minds be challenged and changed so that we are not captive to the teachings and structure of our society.

Within church and society today we continue the struggle to break free from principles and ideologies that keep LBGTQ individuals, people of color, women, those unemployed or underemployed and countless others, oppressed. As our hearts and minds are transformed, God can use us to transform the world to more clearly reflect the kingdom of God.
