Hold Legal Clinics (Apply for a grant from AMMPARO)

Open up a day or more in which anyone with immigration questions can receive free consultation from attorneys. Example: \$5000 grant from AMMPARO will cover about 3 clinics in 1 year, can apply multiple years, clinics are 4 hours each beginning with group presentation followed by a first come first serve 25-30 minute consultation by stipend lawyers (~\$250 each per clinic). Courtroom Accompaniment (Guardian Angels program via AMMPARO)

Congregation members can offer rides to people who are going to court for immigration-related issues, and also accompany them during the hearing. Visibility helps!

You may also have local groups that are involved with similar programs.

Start a Bond Fund

Raise funds to help those who have been detained or are facing legal charges but cannot afford an attorney.

Pen Pals

Write letters to people who are already detained in detention facilities.

Partner with a Congregation already Involved

Is there a congregation in your area holding clinics, is raising funding, etc.? Consider supporting their efforts

Letter Writing to Legislators and to the Editor

Set time for folks to gather to write letters to congress, using talking points, list of contacts, postage, and envelopes

Other things to add or consider:

- Community stories for bulletin/newsletter: Who in your community is an immigrant?
- Know your rights cards- add as detachable section of the handout: hotline numbers and basic "know your rights" if ICE shows up- to be carried and handed out to those who are vulnerable, one side English, one side Spanish
- Include immigrants and refugees in prayers of the people- congregations can write these
