## **Final Information You Should Know**

We believe that voting misinformation is a form of voter suppression. Because we want everyone to be well-informed and confident when they go to cast their ballot, we have created and collected numerous resources to equip voters in the final stages of the election.

We are only days away from November 3<sup>rd</sup>, the final day to cast your ballot in the Presidential Election. There is whirlwind of information, including misinformation, circulating before election day, which can cause voters to be overwhelmed or confused. Our final Ballot Box FAQ video, titled Five Things Every Voter Should Know Before They Head to the Polls, aims to help voters navigate the last days of the election. This video covers Early Voting before the election, the need to hand deliver your absentee ballot, and last-minute voting resources to help answer any final questions at the polls.

## **Other Crucial Voting Information**

To further inform and protect voters, we have compiled a list of additional items voters need to be aware of as they go vote:

- Early Voting Ends Friday, October 30<sup>th</sup>: While Early Voting official ends on Sunday, November 1<sup>st</sup>, many municipal clerk's offices are closed on the weekends. This means if you plan to vote in person absentee, you should do it today. Or at the very least check to make sure your early voting location is open this weekend.
- Hand Deliver Your Absentee Ballot: All ballots have to arrive by 8:00 on Election Day (see "Ballot Boxes" below). Because we are less than a week away from November 3<sup>rd</sup>, you can no longer send your absentee ballot through the mail. You must now hand deliver it to your municipal clerk's office or a designated ballot box.
- Bring Your Photo ID to the Polls: All voters need to bring a valid form of photo ID when they go vote. Most common examples include a WI Driver's License and U.S. Passport. If you also need to register, you must bring a proof of residency, such as a utility bill.
- **Curbside Voting:** Curbside voting is available to any voter who is immunocompromised, was exposed to or has symptoms of COVID-19, as well as voters who have a disability. If you qualify in one of these categories, you have the right to demand curbside voting.
- Ballot Boxes: Absentee Ballot Drop Boxes are available in cities across the state. Check your municipal clerk's office to see if you have a drop box location. One important note: <u>Drop box locations will close between 7:15-7:30 on election day</u>, despite polls not closing until 8:00. This is because ballots have to be received to the clerks by 8:00 sharp, and ballot boxes need to be delivered. Plan you turn in your absentee ballot before 7:00pm on election day.
- Stay in Line: Polls are open Tuesday, November 3<sup>rd</sup>, from 7:00am 8:00pm. If you are in line at your polling place by 8:00pm, you are allowed to vote. So stay in line!
