2023-2025 Wisconsin State Budget

On Feb. 15, Governor Evers will release his new biennial state budget, which the public will have opportunities to comment on. By the way, one of our former interns, Kyle Kretschmann, helps to work on state budgets through his position as Budget and Policy Analyst at the Wisconsin Department of Administration State Budget Office!

Along with keeping you updated on public hearings and the budget process, we are holding an **Interfaith Day of Advocacy** with Faith in Place, formerly known as Wisconsin Interfaith Power & Light, on March 21. Although we won't have time to address all the priorities LOPPW will focus on in the budget or all of the priorities that you may have at our March event, we will help attendees to discern parts of the budget related to hunger, climate, and water. Wisconsin Supreme Court Elections

The Wisconsin Supreme Court is comprised of seven justices elected in statewide, non-partisan elections. Each justice is elected for a ten-year term. Only one justice may be elected in any year. The upcoming decisions you will help to make in the primary on February 21 and then in the general election on April 4 will help determine the ideological balance of the court for the next two year.

Reproductive rights have received a lot of attention during this WI Supreme Court race. Read more here: "The high-stakes race in Wisconsin that could impact abortion rights - and 2024" in "Politico." But the final outcome will have broad implications for several issues, including voting rights, redistricting, environmental protections, and the ability of any leaders to overturn an election, as was attempted for the 2020 election.
