The chaplain was able to read the room and after being with them for a while, he asked the husband, "If you could have done anything differently in your life, what would it have been?" To the woman's great surprise, her husband looked over at her and responded, "I would have treated her better." It was a memory she held on to.

Perhaps many people on their deathbeds have flashes of realization. Maybe some will grow up to realize what matters for the first time after wasting years living in ignorance. We are reminded during the Advent season to be alert now. "Prepare the way of the Lord." Dwell in that place of real security, and not one that leads us to blame everyone around us without repentance.
